PICPA Metro Manila members and friends helped victims of Typhoons Rolly and Ulysses



On November 1, Super Typhoon Rolly left extensive destruction in the Bicol Region, and inflicted significant damage in the provinces of Albay, Catanduanes and Camarines. MMR coordinated with MM GAO, the four chapters, and the Metro Manila CSR teams for a fund drive and collectively donated P250,000 for victims of Typhoon Rolly in the Bicol Region.







On November 11, Typhoon Ulysses, brought powerful winds and torrential rain that killed people, destroyed homes, and caused floods to low-lying areas of Metro Manila, and the provinces of Cagayan and Isabela. Mobilizing the Metro Manila CSR teams, we distributed relief goods composed of hot adobo meals, hygiene kits, rice, water, blankets, mosquito nets and medicine to:

- 500 families in Bgy Geronimo, Rodriguez Rizal on Saturday November 14
- 500 families in Purok 5, Malanday, Marikina on Saturday, November 14
- 300 families in Bgy Malanday, Marikina on Sunday, November 15
- 400 families in Bgy Tumana, Marikina on Sunday, November 29

Metro Manila also sent rice, canned goods, hygiene kits, medicine, mats and mosquito nets to Cagayan (400 families) and Isabela (400 families) through PICPA Chapter presidents, Giged Batung and Monette Alburo.

WMMC's Joint Outreach Program with Tinig Ng Silangan Inc. and JuanSmile to help the victims of Typhoon Ulysses in Cagayan

Responding to the cry for help of the people who were badly affected by Typhoon Ulysses in the Provinces of Cagayan and Isabela, Tinig ng Silangan, Inc. and JuanSmile in partnership with PICPA Western Metro Manila Chapter had initiated a joint outreach program titled "Laban Cagayan, Sama Sama Isabela". Relief goods were transported to Cagayan Province through the help of the Training and Doctrine Command of the Philippine Army – Pangkat Tradoc and were distributed by volunteers from PICPA Cagayan Chapter, the WMMC's Adopted Chapter, headed by Giged Tong-Battung and from a group formed in Cagayan for Tinig ng Silangan, Inc. and JuanSmile headed by Carla Marie

Sumigad who was also a former Committee Chair of PICPA WMMC. Last November 22, 2020, the program had reached almost 500 family-beneficiaries at Alitungtung, Amulung West and Afusing Daga, Alcala and almost 200 families of Sta. Margarita, Baggao. These areas were submerged in floodwater amid the onslaught of Typhoon Ulysses. Most of the people in these places are farmers whose crops were destroyed by the flood.

In the northern provinces, SMMC mobilized a donation drive for Oplan Tulong to provide clean water, ready-to-eat food, clothes and blankets, vitamins and other health




